NOVEMBER - DECEMBER 2024

Literacy

English

- Recites and sings poems, songs and rhymes and enacts plays/skits.
- Enjoys reading through story books and short reads.
- Understands the use of 'a' and 'an' through activities and in sentences. (sorting activity)
- Understands the use of 'in', 'on', 'under' through activities. (play with carton)
- Does related activities .e.g. classifying picture cards under given sentences, making and writing simple sentences using 'in', 'on' and 'under', identifying the use of these concepts in story books etc.
- Expands his\her vocabulary by reading and writing sentences with words of 'ow' sound.
- Reads and writes names of colours. e.g. green, red and uses them while writing.
- Understands the use of 'ing' as action words and others. e.g. singing, king. Enjoys reading simple stories from picture books and multiple readers.

Numeracy

- Addition facts of numbers till 10.
- Strengthens the concept of addition through word problems and stories. (0-20)
- Addition of numbers with and without picture. (0-20)

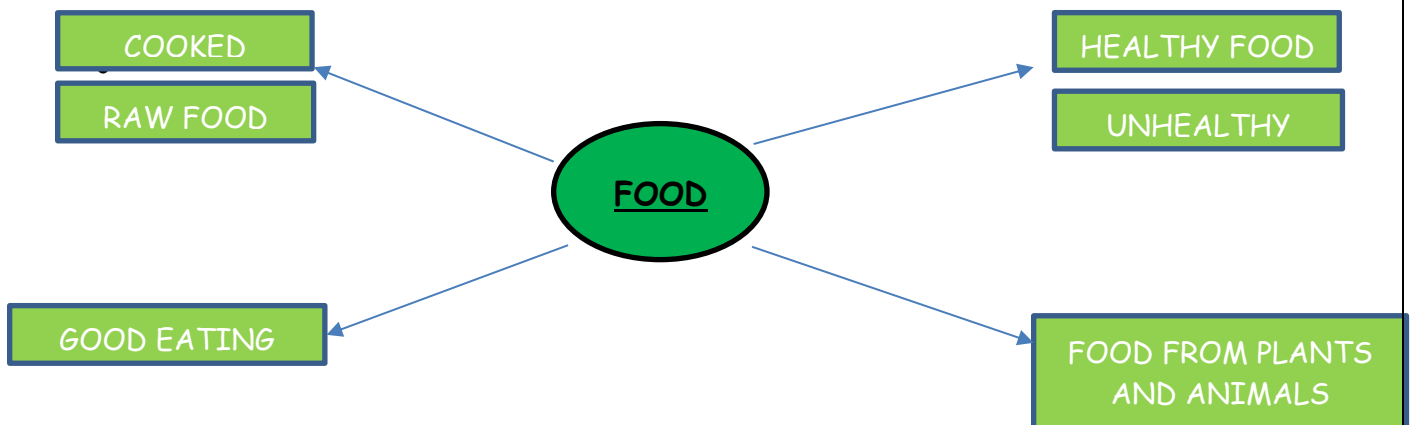

- Subtraction of two digits and single digit number with and without picture clue (without borrowing). (0-20)
- Practices the number-names from 0 to 60.

WORLD AROUND US

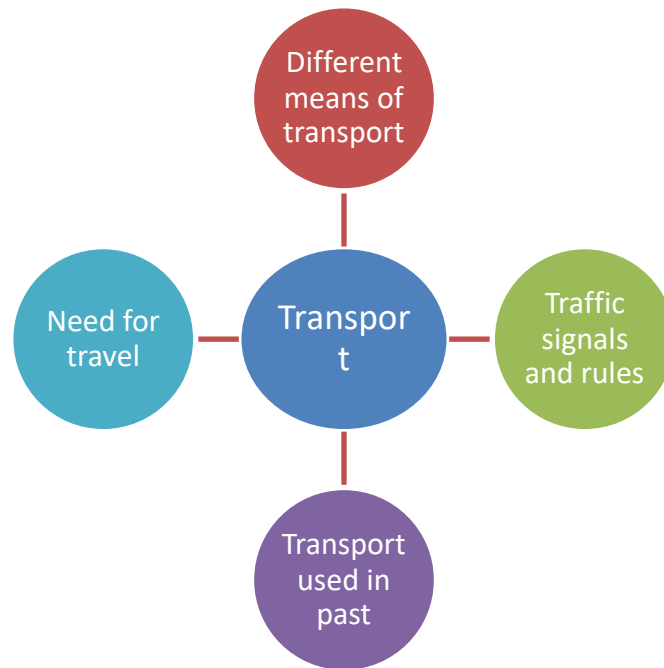
FOOD

- Understands the importance of eating healthy and to avoid unhealthy food.
- Classifies food into plant based and animal based.
- Learns about food that is cooked and that is eaten raw.
- Learns and talks about good eating habits and practices them in daily life.



TRANSPORT- GOING PLACES

- Understands the need for travel.
- Classifies different means of transport as land transport, air transport and water transport.
- Collects pictures of different of some common signages and learns about the varioustraffic rules.
- Observes and understands the differences in lifestyles during winter and summer. E.g. use of heaters, geysers, and wearing warm clothes.
- Enjoys eating winter vegetables and fruits and compares them with other seasonal vegetables and fruits.



Suggested activities

Literacy

- English

Preposition Treasure Hunt

Materials Needed: Small treasures (toys, stickers, or coloured paper pieces)

A room or outdoor space with various objects (table, chair, box, shelf, etc.)

Instructions: Set up the room: Hide the treasures in different places around the room or space, keeping in mind the prepositions "in," "on," and "under." For example:

Place a treasure in a box.

Put one on a chair.

Hide another under a table.

Clue Cards: Write simple clues on cards to help the children find the treasures. Each clue should use one of the three prepositions. Examples:

"Look in the box."

"Find the treasure on the chair."

"Is there something under the table?"

The Hunt: Give your child a clue card and have them search for the treasure based on the preposition.

When they find a treasure, they must describe where it was using the correct preposition, e.g., "The treasure was in the box!"

Extension Idea:

For extra fun, you can ask the children to hide treasures for you and write their own clues using "in," "on," and "under."

Matra Addition

To help reinforce your child's understanding of matras provide your child with some colorful clay and a set of word flashcards paired with pictures. These words should not include the matras for 'ए' and 'ऊ' initially. Along with the word cards, you can also display flashcards that showcase all the matras your child has learned so far, acting as a helpful reference.

Next, ask your child to pick their favorite clay colors and use them to add the appropriate matras to the words on the flashcards where they are missing. Encourage them to carefully look at the reference matra flashcards to ensure they are adding the correct ones.

This activity makes learning matras more engaging and also boosts their language development and fine motor skills as they shape the clay. You can encourage them to experiment with different words, and celebrate their efforts as they complete each word with the correct matra. This hands-on learning approach ensures that your child is having fun while practicing an essential part of the Hindi language!

Numeracy

Learning Addition facts

Take a circular cardboard and write a number on it. Now take lots of ice-cream sticks and write different equations like $2+6$, $8+0$, $4+4$ etc. Child will look for them and put them around the correct circular cardboard. For ex- child will put pegs of equations $2+6$, $8+0$, $4+4$, $7+1$ around the cardboard which has 8 written on it.



World Around Us

To increase awareness about the surroundings, the roads safety rules, let's engage our children in a fun learning experience about road signs! To help the children create their own stick flashcards, start by researching road signs together. Take them on a ride around the neighbourhood, help them spot and tell them about different signs put up across the roads. Make the child draw all the signs on a sheet of paper/ file and write about them.

Encourage the child to choose any three signs, use sturdy paper or cardboard to create flashcards and draw each sign along with it's name. They will bring it to the class and share their meaning and significance with their peers. This activity will not only help them learn about road safety but will enhance their creativity and develop confidence.
