

The maiden edition Gyan Bharati School Model United Nations conference took place on April 20th and 21st, 2024.

This collaborative event, organized in partnership with The Indraprastha Collaborative, witnessed enthusiastic participation from over 320 students representing various schools across Delhi NCR.



The glorious event began with the lamp lighting ceremony by our respected director Lata Ma'am, Principal Mrs. Mudita Sharma, Vice Principal, Mr. Sanjay Bharadwaj, and the Key note speaker Dr. Ankita Chakravarty. It was followed by various beautiful performances which included a Manipuri invocation dance and two melodious group songs by the students.

One of the key features of the MUN was its beginner's committee UNEP, which was specially designed for students from class 6th to 8th. It received an overwhelming response of over 60 delegates. The kids learned about making resolutions, speeches and how to behave as a diplomat.



The conference focused on the agendas which are relevant in the present times and targeted to get viable solutions to the problems. The agendas were as follows:

- 1. United Nations General Assembly (UNGA): Discussing upon the local and global consequences of Israel-Palestine conflict with special emphasis on Houthi attacks in Red Sea.
- 2. UN Commission On The Status Of Women (UNCSW): Deliberation upon the condition of women in conflict and post-Conflict Settings.
- 3. All India Political Parties Meet (AIPPM): Crisis of Secularism and weakening contours with special emphasis on recent religious places and developments.
- 4. UN Office On Drugs And Crime (UNODC): Analysing global drug trafficking trends with special emphasis on legal frameworks with international corporation to combat networks efficiently.



- 5. World Health Organisation (WHO): Global strategies on accessible Universal Healthcare with special emphasis on the Pandemic Treaty Negotiations.
- 6. UN Environment Programme (UNEP): Sustained Planned Developed Cities (Smart Cities). {BEGINNER COMMITTEE)
- 7. <u>International Press Corporation (IPC)</u>: Journalism, Photography, Caricature .

The school received a great response from others schools and was honoured for having school delegations from Birla Vidya Niketan, Ramjas International, Sanskriti School, The Mann School and many more.

In the end the closing ceremony featured a group song performed by grade 12 students and an address by the school principal. The most anticipated part of the ceremony was the announcement of the committee awards.
