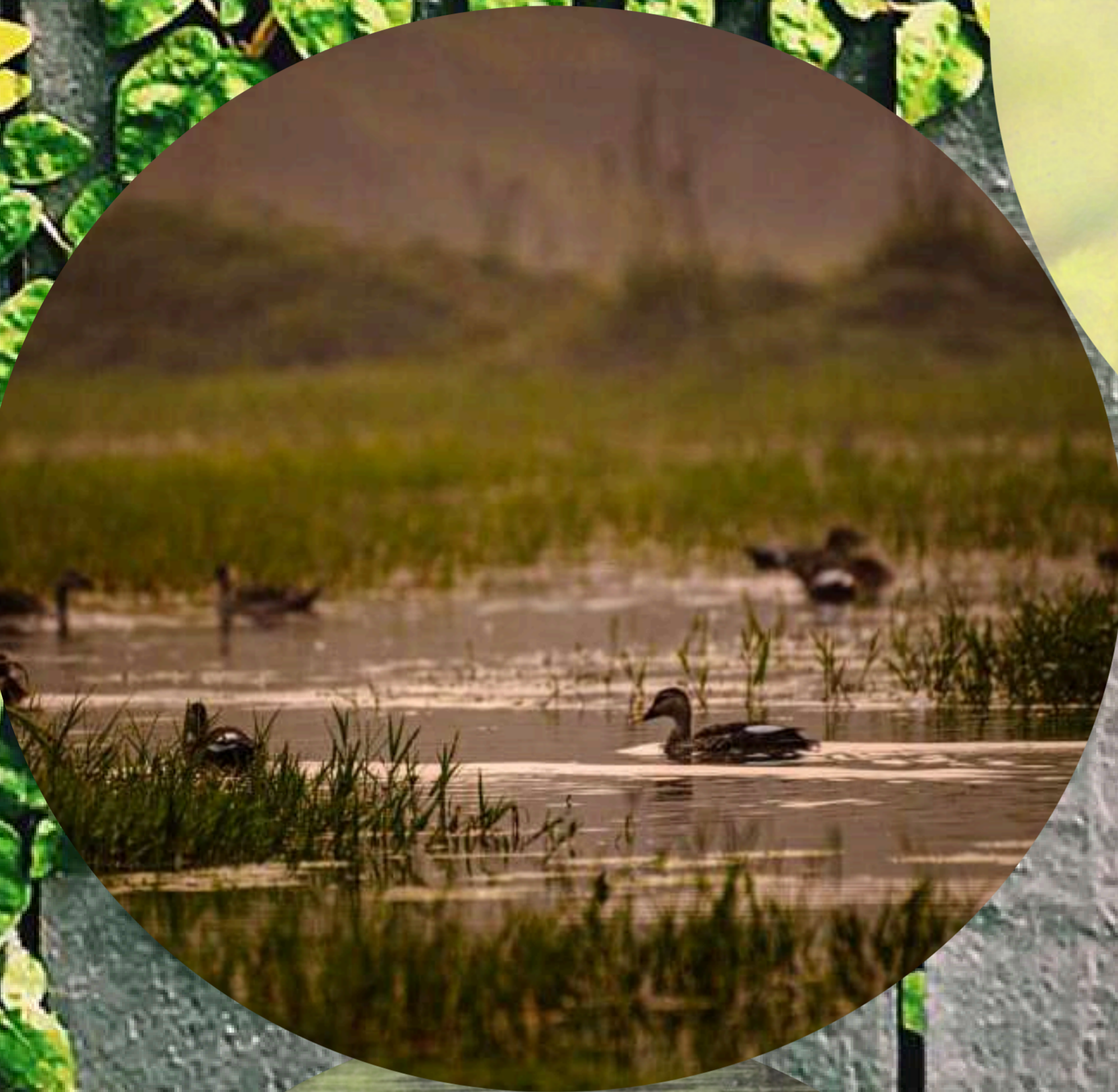

On November 7, 2024, the young enthusiasts of The Photography Club at Gyan Bharati School embarked on an exhilarating field trip to Sultanpur Bird Sanctuary, a prestigious wetland area situated in Haryana. The group comprised 12 students, accompanied by two teachers, a parent mentor, Mr. Vineet Kumar, and his guide, Mr. Ram Kumar, who led the children through the interior of the national park.







The primary goal of the visit was to allow students to practice their photography skills by capturing a diverse range of bird species and wildlife. Students captured Lesser Cormorant, Purple Heron, Rose-ringed parakeet, Knob-billed duck, Purple Swamphen, Spotted owl and Spot-billed Duck.



The visit provided the students with invaluable hands-on experience in wildlife photography. They had the opportunity to apply various techniques such as:

Long-distance and Zoom Photography: Capturing birds from a distance without disturbing their natural habitat required patience and technical skills with telephoto lenses.

Lighting and Composition: The students experimented with natural lighting, particularly the early morning light, to create soft and vibrant images of the birds in their environments.

Action Shots: Capturing the dynamic behavior of birds such as the Lesser Cormorant diving or the Flameback Woodpecker drilling into tree bark allowed students to practice fast shutter speeds and perfecting timing.

Wildlife Behavior and Patience: Students learned the importance of patience and being unobtrusive to wildlife in order to capture natural, undisturbed moments.
